UNIFORM

Students are expected to wear either their uniform or sports kit when in the village during school hours on weekdays.

At weekends, 'smart' casual dress is allowed. All students are also expected to possess clothing suitable for formal occasions such as the End of Term Winter Celebration and Speech Day. Sport, including a wide range of activities, is a compulsory element of the co-curriculum programme and the sports kit should be worn when appropriate.

The Headmaster is the final arbiter of what is acceptable.

We have a "School Boutique" offering a wide range of our school uniform and sports clothing. Some items of clothing are compulsory, some are optional.

All students should also bring with them smart clothing suitable for formal occasions, including national dress where appropriate.



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Introduction

At StGIS we believe in the importance of high standards of school uniform as a means of encouraging students to feel a sense of pride and purpose. High standards of uniform contribute to the ethos of the school and it is the responsibility of all students and members of staff to ensure that students are correctly dressed and look smart and formal at all times. They should take action if necessary and students who continually breach the rules on school uniform should be referred to the House parents/Head of Alm.

Full details of school uniform are sent to all parents/guardians when their child is admitted to the school. It is also available from the School uniform shop.

The basic uniform is as follows:

GIRLS

School navy blue knee length skirt
School navy blue school trousers (winter months)
School grey or navy blue v-neck jumper
Navy blue gillet
School blazer (compulsory item)
School tie
Blue shirt (long or short sleeved)
Plain dark brown, navy blue or black low heeled formal shoes
Plain dark brown, navy blue or black low heeled formal boots (winter)
Plain black or navy blue tights (winter)
Plain black or navy blue socks (summer)

Excessive make up and coloured nail varnish are not allowed.

BOYS

Navy blue school trousers
School grey or navy blue v-neck jumper
Blue shirt (long sleeves)
School tie
Navy blue gillet
School blazer (compulsory item)
Plain dark brown, navy blue or black formal shoes
Plain dark brown, navy blue or black formal boots (winter)

Extremes of hairstyle are not permitted.

Plain black, navy blue or dark brown wellington boots and other forms of outdoor footwear are allowed to be worn to and from school in the wet/snow, but the expectations are that formal shoes/boots are changed into upon arrival at school.

Black or navy blue hat, scarf and gloves are allowed to be worn to and from school in cold weather.



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School Coats:



The green school coat can obviously continue to be worn, but you could alternatively wear a full length formal wool coat – no ski jackets please.

Skiing:

As we enter the Winter term please also be aware that you will need:

- Ski socks
- Warm ski gloves
- Warm skiing clothing, to include waterproof jacket and trousers/salopettes
- Goggles

You will also require skis, poles and boots, but there is the option to rent these items.
